At the heart of it all is the Festival Hub at the ARC, University of Glasgow, where you'll find a buzzing programme of free exhibitions, talks, workshops and family-friendly events inspired by our 2025 festival theme Glasgow: The Visionary City.

This year, we're thrilled to partner with the National Trust for Scotland to raise awareness of Mackintosh Illuminated, a project spotlighting the legacy of creative visionaries Charles Rennie Mackintosh and Margaret Macdonald.

We're also proud to partner with Glasgow Disability Alliance and Bike for Good to champion active travel, making it easier and greener to explore the city's hidden gems, while also highlighting the barriers to active travel that many disabled people face.

Keep an eye out for The Air We Breathe, a unique mobile exhibition cycling through the city, highlighting the improvements in the city's air quality over the past 50 years.
