GET READY FOR GLASGOW DOORS OPEN DAYS FESTIVAL 2026!

We're thrilled to announce that the 37th Glasgow Doors Open Days Festival (GDODF) returns from 17-20 September 2026!

Organised by [Glasgow Building Preservation Trust](#) since 1990, the festival has grown into Scotland's largest free celebration of architecture, heritage and community.

The 2025 Festival was our most ambitious yet. By opening hidden civic, religious, industrial and private spaces across Glasgow – and keeping every experience free – we welcomed 40,000 visits (a 30% increase on 2024), with 178 venues, 129 open buildings, and 320 primary pupils taking part in our Schools Programme.

A huge thank you to everyone who supported, visited and took part, as well as to our generous funders and sponsors – we truly couldn't keep the doors open without you.

In 2026, expect 120+ open buildings and a packed programme of walks, tours, workshops and family-friendly activities – all completely free.

OUR IMPACT

Glasgow Doors Open Days Festival reaches all four corners of the city. For many participating organisations, the Festival is their busiest weekend of the year. Since its inception, over 1.8 million people have taken part in the festival, contributing to its long-term civic impact.

The Festival has seen steady growth since covid, demonstrating its ability to connect with new audiences:

2021 - 14500 visits
2022 - 24000 visits
2023 - 31000 visits
2024 - 30000 visits
2025 - 39000 visits

2026 FESTIVAL THEME

Our exciting festival theme for 2026 is:

“Glasgow Goes Out: The Places That Made Us”

The festival theme helps keep the programme fresh and encourages participants to think creatively about how heritage can be presented. We would love as many participants as possible to embrace the theme, but it’s not compulsory for taking part.

This year, we’re looking back warmly on shared life in the city, celebrating how Glaswegians, visitors, and all those who have called Glasgow home have come together over the past hundred years to relax, express themselves, and feel part of something bigger.

From grand cinemas, tearooms and bandstands to dancehalls, artist-led spaces, grassroots music venues and legendary club nights, this nostalgia-fuelled theme invites visitors to explore - or return to - the places that have made generations feel alive, day and night.

By shining a light on both lost and still-thriving venues, the festival theme seeks to capture and celebrate the buzz, freedom and creative energy that have drawn people to Glasgow for decades.

Through walks, talks, exhibitions and inclusive events across the North, Southside, East End, West End and City Centre, we’re inviting everyone to share their memories of chance encounters, formative moments, and unforgettable days and nights out over the years.

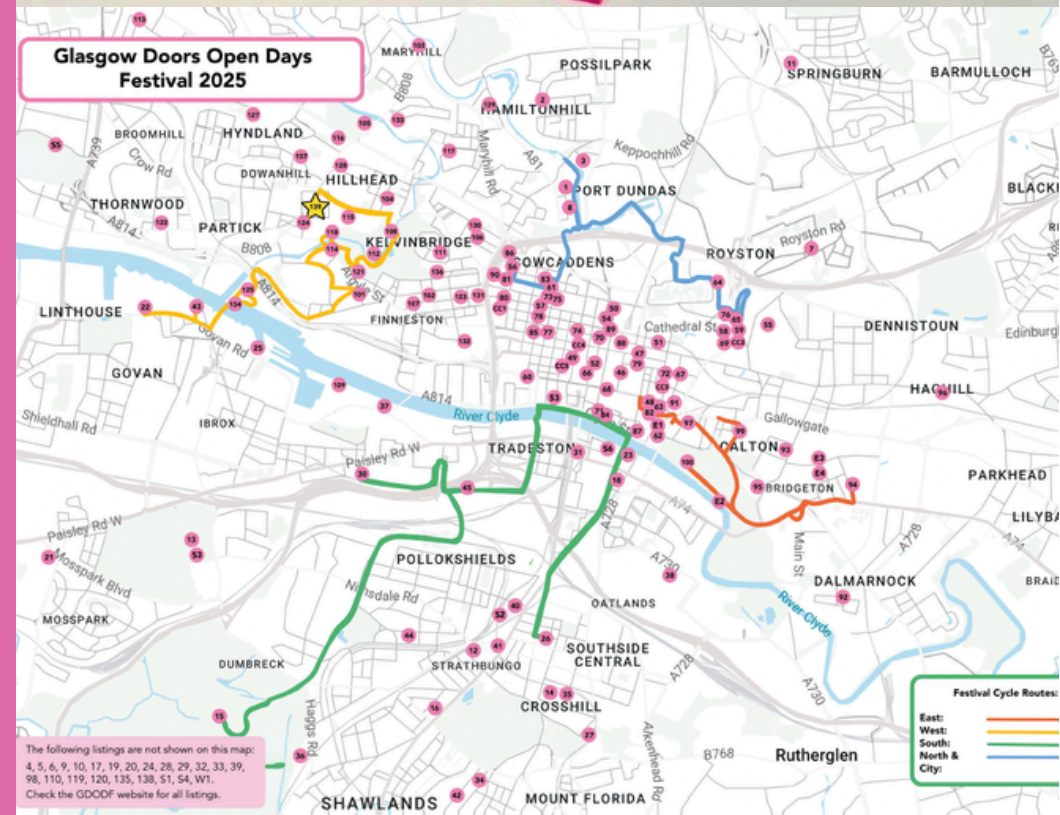
